

Meet The Candidates tonight in Marton

Meet the Rangitikei Candidates is on tonight from 6.30pm in the Marton Friendship Club Hall in Morris St and entry is free.

Project Marton is hosting the Meet The Candidates evening, with deputy mayor Nigel Belsham as MC.

Cath Ash from Project Marton says, "Be sure you know who you are voting for this election. With such pressing issues facing the shape of our communities, from employment, housing, environment and climate change; having the right people in government to determine our future is critical. Whatever your political leaning, keeping abreast of policies that will affect you and your future is paramount to a strong and focused political direction. You can go along to the Friendship Hall, tonight and meet all the candidates who want to represent you in parliament.

"They have all been given a set of questions posed by our community and have a set time in which to answer them. The Blue Tie Ball was a resounding success on Saturday night, organiser Emily Rayner says, "Last Saturday night, the third Blue Tie Ball took place at Marton Memorial Hall, in support of the Palmerston North Rescue Helicopter. "Thunderstorms outside might've prevented the Rescue Chopper from performing a surprise landing but that didn't put a damper on the evening. With over 300 guests in attendance and with the help of our sponsors, the night raised \$40,000 for the Rescue Helicopter. "It kicked off with live entertainment by musician Brian Baillie, before the auction. The evening went into the early hours, with band Twisted keeping the crowd on its feet and an amazing spread by the Verdict Café.

"Top auctioneer Phil Transom did a superb job, keeping the crowd entertained and having guests dig deep into their pockets. Our guests were very generous and over \$29,000 was raised solely from the auction. Without our sponsors, this would not have been possible." The biggest auction sponsor, J J Walters Ltd donated a driveway that raised \$11,000. The organising team of Emily and Dominic Rayner, Gabi Rivers and Jason Wing say they would like to thank all the guests who attended the evening and all the sponsors who made the night possible. Merger proposed to secure Edale's future

The trustees of the Edale Aged Care Community Trust are exploring a merger with The Masonic Villages Trust as a way to secure the future of its aged care centre in Marton.

Edale, the only aged care provider in the Rangitikei, has been relying on donations from the local community to stay afloat.

“Edale cannot continue to rely on the generosity of the Rangitikei community in order to meet its financial obligations. We need to come up with a way of ensuring that Edale is financially viable and has the resources to meet the future needs of our community,” says Trust chair Dudley Brown.

“A merger with an organisation like The Masonic Villages Trust, which shares our charitable ethos, offers many potential advantages. Costs associated with governance, compliance, accounting, marketing and project management would be shared across a wider base. Bulk purchasing would result in cost savings.

“Also we would be able to provide staff with greater job security, more professional development and the



opportunity to share expertise with colleagues.

“At this stage, subject to the outcome of negotiations, I believe the merger would be the best option. It would secure the future of Edale in Marton; serving the needs of our residents and the wider Rangitikei community.”

Mr Brown says the trust board is making constitutional changes to enable it to merge with Masonic, if that is what the trustees of both organisations agree to do.

“Both trusts see the merit in the proposed merger, but we first need to complete many processes including due diligence and obtain consents

from agencies such as the Whanganui District Health Board. Once a clear position has been reached, we will provide more details to the community,” he says.

The Masonic Villages Trust has operated in the southern North Island for 50 years. It has rest home/hospitals in Levin, Lower Hutt, Masterton and Palmerston North, where it also has retirement communities. In addition, it has a six standalone retirement villages in Taranaki and another in Foxton. It also provides rental flats in many of its villages.

Masonic Villages Trust chief executive Warick Dunn says the trust is one of the largest charitable aged-care providers in the southern North Island.

“But in the context of the whole aged care sector, we are a relatively small player, with villages that are smaller than those provided by the large commercial operators,” he says.

“We believe we perform an important social role, by providing people from all walks of life with affordable, quality aged care facilities. We do this in the small towns and cities of the region, through local managers, who have a high level of autonomy.

“Edale would fit in very well with what we are doing. Also, there is strength in numbers – having villages and care facilities in towns across the southern North Island, makes each village more resilient and their residents more secure.”

Mr Brown says there is constant financial pressure on small, stand-alone aged care providers.

“This pressure has been increased, following the recent government decision to address pay equity for care-givers. This means our trained and loyal staff are now appropriately rewarded but their wage increases have not been fully-funded by the government, leaving the trust with a shortfall to meet.”

Mayor Andy Watson presented the medals and certificates saying, "These awards reward and identify people who contribute to our community. Congratulations, you have all done such amazing things."

The four recipients are: Primary school pupil Waitatia Ratana-Karehana, college pupil and training cadet Aaron Mulligan, both from Marton and Taihape Fire Fighters Rowan Bradley and Jack Murrell. It's the second time youth awards have been presented in the district.

Waitatia Ratana-Karehana, a 12 year old, is currently head girl at Marton Junction School and very active in the community. She says, "I was shocked but really happy, when I was told," She had a couple of very proud parents at the ceremony. Aaron Mulligan, aged 16 was chosen to represent the Air Training Corps and to be part of the NZ Defence Force contingent to travel to Belgium for the 100th commemoration of the Battle of Messines. Howie Tamati (Maori Party) - a New Plymouth district councillor.

Incumbent Adrian Rurawhe (Labour).

All three men are in the race to win the Te Tai Hauāuru seat on September 23. It is one of four Maori electorates being contested in 2017.

Time run out to make voting easy

Time has run out for people who wanted to add their name to the Electoral Roll to make voting easy in the 23 September general election.

The deadline to be included on the printed electoral roll was Wednesday 23 August. Anyone enrolled that will have to cast a special declaration vote.

"You can still enrol right up until the day before Election Day, including at any advance voting place," says Ms Wright, "but you'll need to make a special vote."

"A special vote takes a bit longer and means filling in an extra form. That's why we encouraged people to get enrolled early."

"Enrolling is easy. Voters can freetext their name and address to 3676, get a form from a PostShop or call Freephone 0800 36 76 56. People can also enrol or update their details online at www.elections.org.nz."

"The Marton branch of the Cancer Society is a small but very active group. We are blessed by having many wonderful volunteers who we can call on to help us; especially our wonderful drivers who are on call to take clients to Palmerston North or Wanganui hospitals," says Shirley Murray from the local Cancer Society.

"Patients need to go to Palmerston North five days a week, for five to six weeks, for radiotherapy treatment. This can be a very stressful time for them. We have also have clients whose chemotherapy treatment can last between one and three hours but this is still no problem to our drivers."

"Sometimes last year, we were very, very busy with transport; taking clients for treatment. But once again, our drivers were only too happy to oblige. The Cancer Society compensates drivers by giving them petrol vouchers but we have some drivers who don't want any payment. "To all these people we say a very big thank you."

Proposed new subdivision in Marton

We are short of housing -Mayor

Mayor Andy Watson comments on the state of housing in the Rangitikei District.

“We are short of housing stock throughout the whole district. It started in Bulls and Marton and now includes the whole district.

“There are two reasons. The first is the excellent lifestyle we enjoy in Rangitikei and housing affordability. People out of Auckland and Tauranga can sell up and buy a home here and still have money in the bank and buyers can afford a first home.

“The second reason is that commercially the district is on a roll, with companies enquiring about setting up in the district.

“The good news is the population is up. I am looking forward to the next census.

“Council accepts there is a housing shortage and we have to attract someone to do a subdivision – there is scope for the council to act as a facilitator perhaps providing the infrastructure, (adding a lean on the properties to be recouped when sections are bought and developed.)

“Council has formed a working group on subdivisions made up of four councillors but ideas will need to go before the full RDC.

“We have to look at ways to incentivise for example -in Bulls we have council land that we could look to develop.

“We are aware of potential housing developments and are talking to a number of people about how we can help.

“The Rangitikei District Plan has been reviewed very recently and it’s very permissive in nature. In it we have indicated a number of areas available for urban growth.

An increase in sections is positive; it means an increase in the overall rate take for the district.

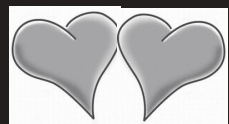

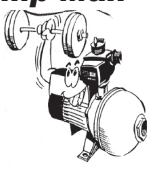
